## Internship

Bachelor's students of European Studies complete a compulsory internship. The main goal is to apply and deepen course conte while gaining practical experience. This usually does not mean that certain knowledge can be used directly, but that theoretical knowledge is transferred to practical skills. Furthermore, internships offer the opportunity to test possible jobs and find out which activities or professions are suitable for each student. With a bit of luck, they can also help you meet professionals and forge link for the time after graduation. To achieve these goals, the choice of the internship location and your own commitment during the internship are decisive.

You can complete your internship either in Germany or abroad - you decide where and in which area to undertake your internshi However, it is important that the internship is clearly related to the course content.
